## Four Latin Club Students Attend National JCL Convention at KU

Four Members of Webster's Latin Club, Sue Erbe, Bev Quist, James Brown, and Tate Pursell, attended the Tenth Annual Latin Club Convention of the National Junior Classical League. The Convention was held August 11 through August 15 at the University of Kansas, Lawrence, Kansas. The election of national officers was the main purpose of the convention. Tate was chairman and Sue was secretary of a workshop on Latin publications. They are co-editors of The Latinus Rumor, The newspaper published by Webster's Latin Club.

The delegates took part in contests on such subjects as Roman customs and Roman life. Latin vocabulary, and Roman and Greek mythology. Tate won third place in a contest concerning English derivatives of Latin words.

The delegates also participated in interest groups directed by professors of the University of Kansas. They attended athletic contests fashioned after the Roman Olympics. Students also took part in "A Day in Old Rome" when the only dress allowed was that typical of ancient Rome, such as togas and stolas.

## YMCA Anticipates Year's Activities Youth Council Plans Meetings; Denny White To Run for Governor at Model Convention

Student body president Denny White has announced that he is running for governor in the Missouri YMCA's Youth and Government Program. Youth and Government acquaints high school students with the operation and function of a democratic system of government.

Under the legislative procedure, a caucus is held at Webster in which candidates are nominated for state offices. Early in December a convention is held with YMCA area branches. Then in the spring, the Model General Assembly is held at Jefferson City.

In judicial procedures of the Youth and Government program, two students sign up as lawyers and take a model case against another pair. Both sides have an adult lawyer who works with them on the case. Each trial is held with an actual Circuit Court judge presiding. The jury is made up of students, usually a civics class. "Witnesses" are also students. After verdicts have been handed down, cases may be appealed to the Model Supreme Court. If granted, the appeals are heard at Jefferson City during the Model General Assembly. Supreme Court Judges are students who have been

lawyers at least two years.

The senior Hi-Y and Tri-Hi-Y club members have been working on the Buzz Book, the school telephone directory, under the chairmanship of Guy Mellor and Tate Pursell.

All Hi-Y and Tri-Hi-Y clubs will begin their 1963-64 programs the second and third weeks of September.
