

'63 Seniors Pick Colleges, Work Job-Hunting Students State Work Preferences

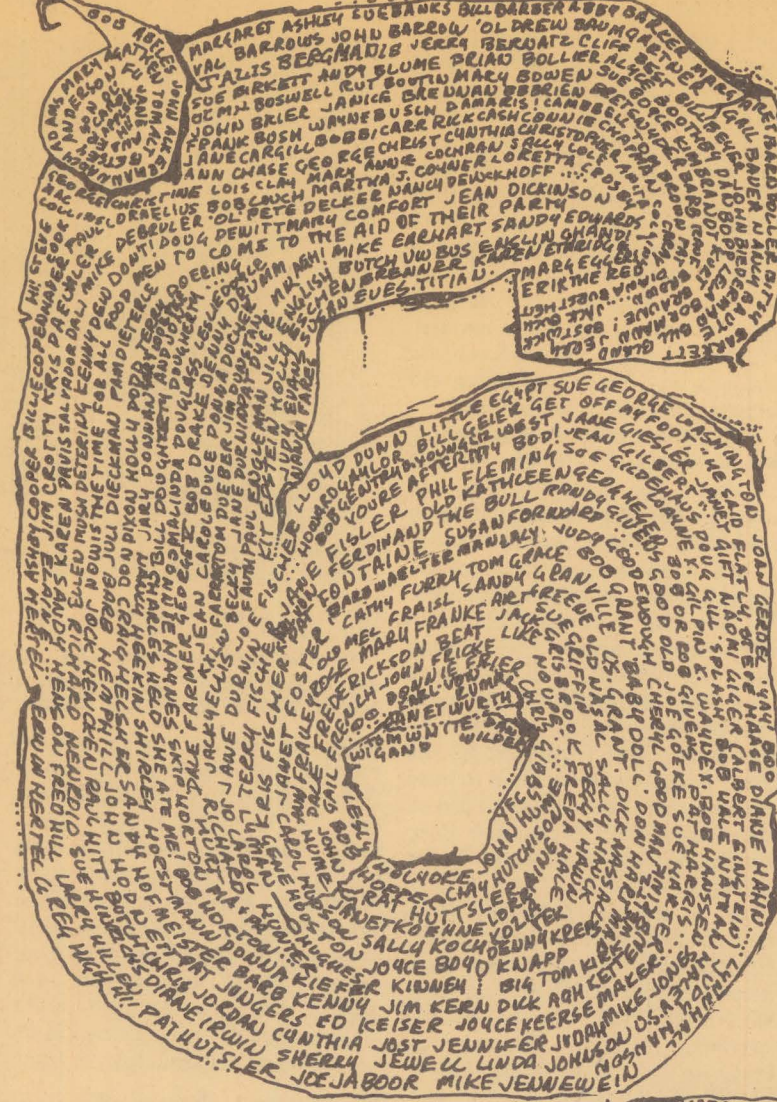

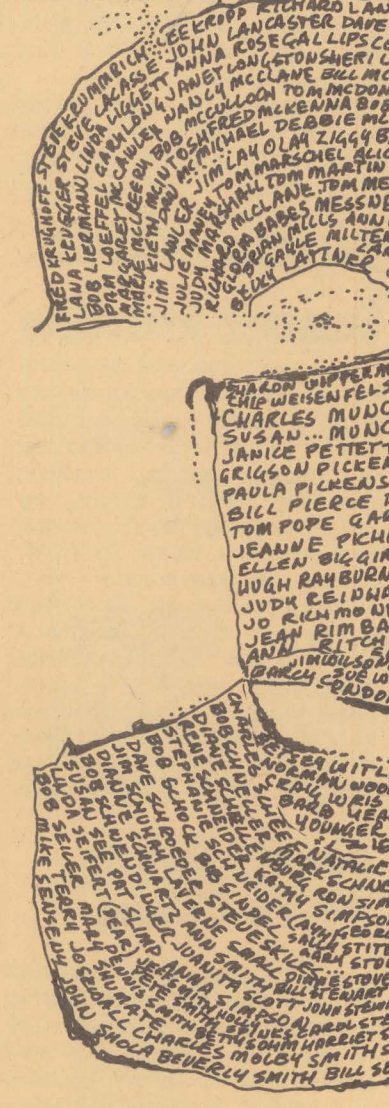
