## Trackmen set 16 school records:

Webster's trackmen, coached by Mr. Robert Hoffman and Mr. Jack Jones, ran to a strong finish this year. Sixteen school records broken, good and consistent team performances, and some outstanding individual efforts highlighted a successful season.

In the State Outdoor track meet at the University of Missouri May 15 and 16, the Statesmen placed seventeenth among all the schools participating. Coach Hoffman was "well pleased" with their showing. He said, "We came in seventh in the mile relay, sixth in the 880 yard relay, and Mike Williams took second in the high jump with a new school record, 6 feet 3 inches."

The 880 relay team consisted of Walter Smallwood, junior; John Harrison, senior; Rick Smith, senior; and Scott Crain, junior. The mile relay team -- Scott Crain; Kurt Wiswehr, junior, Bob Brandin, junior; and Mike Williams, senior, ran to a new school record at Columbia.

Without the help of sprinter Walter Smallwood, Webster won a close 114-113 victory over Lindberg in a dual meet May 12. Double winners were John Harrison, Ron Mautz, and a junior division weight man, Tim Currie.

Mike Williams was a triple winner. In his season's first attempt at the low hurdles, Williams broke the school record, running the 180 yards in 20.9 seconds. Ron Mautz also threw the discus to a school record of 148 feet against Lindbergh.
